INTRODUCTION

This document captures and publishes one piece of correspondence (hereafter, “artifact”) from the collection of World War Two correspondence of Harry William Manchester, of Essex County, Ontario, Canada. Harry spent six years in the Canadian Army, in Ontario, England, and as a prisoner of war held in Poland; and during that period wrote extensively to his relatives and friends. The extensive correspondence Harry wrote to his sister, Mrs. Elton Newman of Cottam, Ontario, Canada was preserved by her, and constitutes the bulk of this correspondence collection.

As correspondence, this artifact contains a wide variety of properties, which reflect its content, markings, and references.

The purpose of this document is to capture that content, markings, and properties, so that the artifact may survive in this published form or be transferred to another form, and also to preserve the timeline of historical events in the context of Harry William Manchester. Photographic images of the original parts of the artifact are included in this document, and the reader is encouraged to review those images.

We must be almost this New Brunswick by now. I know they said about 300 miles to Halifax yet.

Elton should see the farms down here. There are a lot of rivers with rapids galore Every since we left Montreal. We have saw Rapids and log jams in them. Also saw the logs coming out of the shoat into the river. That sure is a hivy bridge across the St. Lawrence. Well here I am again. The boys have had their route march & we're off again. There were red cross ladies at that station handing out cigarettes & chocolate bars. We have had a very hardy welcome at every station we stoped at. & have got souviners given to us.

The people all speak Eng. In New Brunswick. But all thro the province of Quebec. We had a hell of a time making them understand what we were saying. It sure is a swell day. & we expect to hit Halifax in about six hours.

Well there isn't much I can tell you in the letters but I have a lot to tell you when I get back. The Regt. That Cliff Kaake is in left Borden 1 ½ weeks ago and no one knew where they were going. But the other side of Three Rivers a little ways we met half of them with an awfull large train of German prisoners & then after we just got this side of Three Rivers we met the rest with another train load. As soon as our boys saw them. They picked up pop bottles & threw them right thro the windows of the other train. ~~They wer~~ We were stoped on a siding & they went past real slow. Well I'll close for this time Franc. "Bye Bye"






